#### PLACES TO PARK YOUR BOAT

State law (no pump-out facility or electricity) prohibits Portsmouth from making its public landings (**High Street Landing and North Landing**) officially available to overnight stays. But the landings are perfect for tying up and enjoying the many great shops, restaurants and attractions in town.

Please note: The landings are adjacent to our residential areas and guests are asked to refrain from airing their laundry – dirty or otherwise (!) – while at the landings.

A few boaters have mentioned noise levels at the two landings. First, the HRT Ferry runs every 30 minutes from Norfolk, VA to both Portsmouth landings. Expect a steam whistle to blow as the ferry backs out into the river. The ferry runs from early morning to late evening each day. Olde Towne is also directly across the river from dry docks and shipyards, which also from time to time get noisy going about their business. *In general,* Olde Towne is a quiet place and if sometimes the ferry or shipyards produce noise, they also add significantly to our unique ambience!

Occasionally this area is subject to extreme high tides thanks to weather or phases of the moon. Expect water over the dock in the North and High Street basins, mostly a problem during north-northeasterly fronts which bring in higher tide waters into the tributaries along the Chesapeake Bay. These are fixed . not floating . docks.

As in most cities, it is best to make sure that you lock your boat up if left unattended. Theft on visitoring boats is very rare, but better be safe than sorry.

**Nota bene:** There is **NO DOCKING** at either landing during 2 event weekends: Cock Island Race (June 15-16, 2012) and the Great Chesapeake Bay Schooner Race (October 12-14, 2012).

A few boaters have mentioned that there is electricity at the High Street Landing basin. True, there is electricity up away from the docks, but it is for CITY USE ONLY! Please do not plug into these circuits. We certainly do not want to create friction with the city by abusing the free docking at the landings.

Swimming Point aka Hospital Point- Open river anchorage. Moor inside the yellow buoys as there is heavy commercial traffic on the Elizabeth River. The best and maybe only open water anchorage in the area. Everyone leaves around 7:30 AM when southbound to make the lock openings. For Norfolk/Portsmouth events (HarborFest in June or the 4th of July) the anchorage is well defined with buoys and heavily patrolled with a water taxi available. Current protection is good inside the yellow buoy, not so good outside. Some complain about the noise (mostly from Norfolk's Town Point weekend events) and commercial traffic, but most haven't found it an issue at all.

We also have 2 great marinas on each side of downtown: **Tidewater Yacht Marina** and **Ocean Marine Yacht Center**, both of which have transient slips (see %Marinas+for more info).

## **GETTING AROUND**

Olde Towne is easy to navigate: by foot, bike, car, or boat!

**Elizabeth River Ferry**. Convenient and scenic transportation between Olde Towne Portsmouth and Downtown Norfolk on the Elizabeth River. Adults \$1.50 and Seniors (over 60+) \$0.75 each way. **Exact change only**, although you may buy roundtrip fares. Pay on board. Dogs and bikes are allowed. Labor Day to Memorial Day (hours are from High Street Landing): Mon-Thurs 7am-10pm, Fri 7am-12am, Sat 10am-12am, Sun 10am-10pm

**The Patriot Inn Bed & Breakfast** (201 North, 757-391-0157) Wonderful B&B one block from North Landing in a fully restored 1784 colonial home.

The Glencoe Inn Bed & Breakfast (222 North, 757-397-8128) Another great B&B a block and a half from the water in a beautiful 1890 home in the heart of the historic district.

**The Governor Dinwiddie Hotel** (506 Dinwiddie, 757-392-1330) A smaller hotel, recently renovated. Small kitchenettes in each room. Right in the middle of restaurants and shopping, 5 blocks from the water.

The Schooner Spirit of Independence (10 Crawford Pkwy; 757-971-1865) offers %Bunk and Breakfast+at the dock. Sleep with the gentle rock of the boat. Gorgeously appointed interior. Best view in town! www.SpiritofIndependence.net

## **BEVERAGES and GROCERIES**

Listed by their proximity to the water...

**Dollar General** (326 High) is only 3 blocks from High Street Landing and has a fairly good stock of dry goods, some fresh milk, eggs, etc., as well as bath and cleaning products.

**7-11** (725 London) convenience store (does sell beer & wine). This 7-11 also has gas and a Redbox for dvd rentals.

**Food Lion** (1503 London) a decent supermarket including beer and wine. Do-able on a bike but best by car/taxi.

HRT bus route #45 from the County Street garage (\$1.50 adult) is several blocks from High Street Landing and will take you to the Victory Crossing Shopping Center, which has a **Farm Fresh** grocery store, **ABC** (state liquor store), **Lowe's**, **Bank of America**, and other shops.

If you love fresh produce, every Saturday from April 21 through Dec. 22<sup>nd</sup> (9am - 1pm) is our local **Farmer's Market** at the intersection of High and Court Streets (4 blocks from the water).

## BIKE RENTALS

**Cycle Classics** (427 High, 757-393-4498) Rents geared (\$35/day) and non-geared (\$25/day) bikes. They specialize in restoration and repair as well as sell new bikes and accessories.

Starboards Coffee Kiosk (101 High right at High street Landing) has the BEST coffee in town, serving Seattles Best brewed as well as espresso drinks: mochas, lattes, and seasonal specialties. They are best known for their signature iced coffee and espresso drinks made with their hand-crafted coffee ice cubes. Starboards features baked goods and BagelNUTZ (yum. the best!!). You can also get savory soups (in season), BBQ and Vienna Beef hot dogs. Open Mon-Fri, 6am-4pm, Sat 7am-3pm and starting 4/15, Sun 7am-3pm. Credit cards now accepted! \*\*\*\*

If you'de looking for some great beans, tea, or equipment for your own brew, check out **Kitchen Koop** (638 High, 757-399-4475).

## **DINING, EVENTS and SHOPPING**

Olde Towne is one of the top dining destinations in Hampton Roads. We have over three *dozen* dining options within walking distance of the river and wonderful antiques shops, art galleries, and specialty stores up and down High Street. Pick up the *Portsmouth Visitor's Guide* at the Visitor's Center (North Landing), Skipjack Nautical Wares (One High Street), or from any of the boxes on the street for complete directories of current restaurants and shops. The *Visitor's Guide* also has a calendar of annual events. A current directory of Olde Towne restaurants is clipped to the center section of this guide. #### **ENTERTAINMENT**

The **Commodore Theatre** (421 High, 757-393-4383) is a fabulous old-fashioned movie theater and **dining room**. Lovingly restored to its original 1945 glory (murals, chandeliers, etc.), the main floor now holds tables with comfy club chairs. Each table has a small lamp and telephone with which to place your dinner and drinks order. First-run movies on a 40 foot screen with state-of-the-art sound system. The prices are VERY reasonable. (If you are not dining, there is also balcony seating on weekends.) Tickets sold for same day performances only. Current movie is on their website: www.commodoretheatre.com.

**nTelos Wireless Pavilion** (901 Crawford, 757-393-8181) is a covered outdoor concert venue right on the water (adjacent to Ocean Marine). Great acts all spring and summer. Check their schedule at www.pavilionconcerts.com. **Ocean Marine** is so close, that often people will rent slips for big concerts and listen to the music from their own boat!

Many local restaurants also have live music on the weekends.

## **FUN FACTOIDS**

- The *first* U.S. naval academy was at the Gosport Navy Yard in Portsmouth, 25 years *before* Annapolis!
- Shipbuilding here dates back to 1620
- The City of Portsmouth was founded in 1752 by Col. William Crawford.
- The first dry dock in the western hemisphere opened here on June 17, 1833. Dry Dock 1, now a national historic landmark, is still in use.
- The CSS Virginia (ex Merrimac) was built right here!

## **LAUNDRY**

The closest laundry for boaters is at **Tidewater Yacht Marina** (just north of North Landing) where access to laundry facilities is available to slipholders and those who pay a dinghy dock fee.

**Mama's Wash and Dry** (2910 High Street) is a full-service laundromat (including wash & fold service) and is accessible by the #47 bus (\$1.50) from the corner of High & Crawford (1 block up High from the High Street Landing) to High & Florida Ave.

#### **LIBRARY**

The Main Library of Portsmouth Public Libraries is walking distance (601 Court St. up 4 blocks from High Street Landing, left at Court 2 blocks) and offers computers and internet access. Re-opened June 2012 after an extensive renovation.

The first Friday and Saturday of every month is their **Friends of the Library Book Sale**, with a huge selection of fiction and non-fiction books sold by the inch. HUGE selection for pennies!!

## **MARINAS**

Ocean Marine Yacht Center (1 Crawford Court, 757-321-7432, www.oceanmarinellc.com) Monitors VHF channel 16. Featuring 122 all-floating slips, each with water, telephone and cable television, and electricity hook-ups. Wireless Internet Service and a Courtesy Car are also available. Restrooms, Showers, Laundry Room and Ships' Store are located in the Dockmaster Building. In addition to its marina complex, Ocean Marine is also a world class, state-of-the-art repair and refit yacht yard and indoor dry storage facility.

**Portsmouth Boating Center** (1244 Bay Street, 757-397-2092, www.yachtworld.com/portsmouthboatingcenter) A full service marina and brokerage.

Tidewater Yacht Marina (10 Crawford Parkway, 757-393-2525, www.tyamarina.com) Monitors VHF channels 16/68. A full service marina with 300 deep-water slips in the basin with 100 slips available for transients. 6 Mega Yacht Slips 130' + T-Dock Positions with fast fueling. Two pump out locations and fuel dock. Ship's Store with extensive supply of marine equipment, supplies, & charts. Three sets of new, air-conditioned tile showers and four washers/dryers. Floating pool with party deck, conference room, and restaurant (%The Deck+) on-site. 60-ton travel lift for haul outs and full service boatyard.

#### **MUSEUMS**

**Children's Museum of Virginia** (221 High, 757-393-5258) After an 18 month renovation, the Children¢ Museum is bigger and better than ever. Great exhibits for all ages, including a large train exhibit. **Fantastic toy store too!** 

**Portsmouth Art & Cultural Center** (corner of High & Court, 757-393-8543) Today our 1846 Courthouse is an art museum with two spacious galleries of ever-changing exhibits.

Jewish Museum & Cultural Center (607 Effingham, 757-391-9266) This rare surviving example of Eastern European Jewish Orthodoxy is about 8 blocks from High Street Landing. It is a place where visitors from home and around the world can celebrate and learn about Jewish history, faith, and culture. The Jewish Museum & Cultural Center houses artifacts and exhibits that reflect the history of the Hampton Roads Jewish community. Lectures and Tours Sat-Sun, 2-4pm.

**Lightship Portsmouth Museum** (at the foot of London St. on the water, 757-393-8741) Lightships were built to help mariners avoid dangerous shoals or enter safely into harbors at night. The Lightship Portsmouth has been restored to its original condition. Visitors can board the vessel and see how the men of the Lightship Service lived during their many months at sea.

**Portsmouth Naval Shipyard Museum** (2 High St. at High Street Landing, 757-393-8591) Exhibiting local and naval history and memorabilia from this centuries-old Southern port.

The **Railroad Museum of Virginia** (adjacent to nTelos Pavilion and Ocean Marine) is not quite open for business, but passers-by can admire the collection of antique railway cars and the Norfolk & Western 1134 steam locomotive.

**Virginia Sports Hall of Fame and Museum** (206 High, 757-393-8031) Two stories of hands-on sports and health exhibits, celebrating nearly 300 past and present athletes and inspiring future ones

The Hog Island Lighthouse Lens (next to High Street Landing and in front of Skipjack Nautical Wares) Having begun service in 1896 as part of the Hog Island Light off the Great Machipongo Inlet on the Eastern Shore, this first-order lens is the only one displayed outside of a museum setting. Free informational card available at Skipjack Nautical Wares.

#### **PETS and VETS**

The historic Olde Towne district of Portsmouth is a great place to walk your dogs and see the early homes, beautifully landscaped streets and numerous parks. A new grassy park area is available along Crawford Parkway (the seawall area near Hospital Point), so there are actually miles of quiet streets and parks for you to walk. Of course, *PLEASE MAKE SURE THAT YOU CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR DOG!* 

There are two good animal hospitals less than a 10 minute drive away.

## **POST OFFICES and DROP BOXES**

The nearest post office is located at 431 Crawford (757-397-2758) about a block and a half from High Street Landing. Open Monday-Friday from 9am-5pm.

The closest post office for **general delivery** of your forwarded mail is at 933 Broad Street, zip **23707** (757-397-0841). A taxi would be the most efficient transport, but you *can* take the #47 bus from High & Crawford (\$1.50, stay on at the County St. garage stop), and get off at High St. & Watson St. Walk about 7-8 minutes: west one block on High, turn right, north 3 blocks on Mt. Vernon, turn right, east one long block on London to Broad St. Cross London (busy divided road) and walk north on Broad. The post office is just on your right.

There is also a mailbox at High and Crawford Streets (outside BB&T) as well as UPS and FedEx drop boxes in the lobby of the BB&T building at High and Crawford.

## **PROPANE**

**Mile Marker "0" Marine Supplies** (One High, 757-618-8885) . Right at High Street Landing. Purchase and exchange.

**7-11** (725 London) . About nine blocks from the water.

### **PUBLIC RESTROOMS**

There are public restrooms in the Water Street Parking Garage (High Street Landing), inside the Visitor Center (North Landing), and in the Middle Street Parking Garage.

## **SOUVENIRS**

**Skipjack Nautical Wares** (#1 High Street at High Street Landing, facing the water) has its own apparel, jewelry, gifts, and postcards (as well as thousands of other nautical items!).

**Starboards Coffee Kiosk** (101 High Street) has great long and short-sleeve t-shirts.

The **Portsmouth Visitors Center** (North Landing, building with blue roof) has a variety of Portsmouth-specific merchandise.

The **Portsmouth Art & Cultural Center Gift Shop** (420 High) also has some Portsmouth-specific merchandise.

## **TOURS**

Col. Crawfords Olde Towne Lantern Tour (757-391-0155) is a must for all ages! A 60-75 minute walking tour of the Olde Towne historical district led by the 1752 founder of Portsmouth. Tues, Thurs, Sat at 7:30 leaving from the Renaissance Hotel (May-June, Sept-Nov; summer by reservation, min. 4 people). ★★★★

The **Path of History** is a self-guided tour winding through Olde Towne with information markers along the way. A walking tour of our neighborhood, you can pick up the Path of History brochure at the Visitors Center (North Landing) and Starboards Coffee Kiosk (High Street Landing).






